CAMPUS SECURITY

It is the obligation of Oconee Fall Line Technical College (OFTC) to ensure orderly operation, to protect the rights of all members of the OFTC community, to prohibit acts which materially and substantially interfere with legitimate educational objectives or interfere with the rights of others and to take disciplinary action where conduct adversely affects the College's pursuit of its educational objectives. (The Student Code of Conduct can be found in the Student Handbook.) OFTC will comply with Title II of Public Law 101-542, Crime Awareness and Campus Security Act. This law is also known as the "Jeanne Clery Act."

If any situation has the possibility of causing harm to anyone at the college, all persons will be immediately notified via the Campus Alert System by the use of the phrase "**Execute Lockdown**" so that they can begin implementing protection procedures as required.

Campus Security Officers

In emergency situations, Uniformed Police Officers, the Emergency Coordinator, the Alternate Coordinator and evening Administrators in Charge (AIC) serve as Campus Security Officers. The Security Officers will provide assistance in both external and internal disruptions. In such incidents, the security officer's directions are to be followed explicitly by all visitors, students and employees. All visitors, students and employees shall not interfere with the Security Officers in the performance of duty.

Identification

All employees, students and visitors are required to wear a visible ID badge at all times when on campus. Failure to wear an ID badge may result in the individual being escorted off campus and/or police/sheriff assistance being requested.

Administration

If there is a concern regarding enforcement of the Code of Conduct, Traffic and Parking Regulations, and/or security procedures, please contact an OFTC employee. Do not interfere with the security officer or attempt to question officer's actions. Statistics concerning campus of criminal offenses are published annually.

Notification

All emergencies, thefts, vehicle accidents, injuries, suspicious persons, suspicious activities, weapons, drugs, or solicitors are reported to Campus Security, College Switchboard or Evening AIC for appropriate action. Those situations that may endanger the health and safety of any visitor, student, or employee on campus should be reported immediately to 911.

This information is supplied in compliance with the federal Jeanne Clery Disclosure of Campus Policy and Campus Crime Statistics Act of 1998. The current Clery Act was formerly known as the Crime Awareness and Campus Security Act of 1990.

Sex Offender Registry and Access to Related Information

The federal Campus Sex Crimes Act, enacted on October 28, 2000, became effective on October 28, 2002. This law mandates that institutions of higher education issue a statement advising the campus community where sex offender information provided by a state may be obtained. Crime Alert Bulletins (Timely Warnings)

In support of crime prevention efforts, each Oconee Fall Line Technical College campus provide reports (Timely Warnings) to its College Communities concerning the occurrence of any Reportable Offense reported to either a local law enforcement agency or to Campus Security where the occurrence of such an offense is deemed by the Interim President to constitute a threat to students or employees.

Drug Free School and Workplace Policy

Oconee Fall Line Technical College believes that illegal drugs and abuse of alcohol have no place in the college environment. The unauthorized manufacture, distribution, dispensing, possession, or use of a controlled substance or alcohol is strictly prohibited in all facilities of the college, in all places where employees/students work/attend, including all state-owned vehicles, and as any part of the college's

activities. As a condition of employment/enrollment, all employees/students shall abide by this prohibition and notify the college of any criminal drug or alcohol use.

Statement of prohibited conduct for a Violence-Free College

No type of violence will be tolerated on OFTC property or in any place where students or employees are engaged in OFTC-related activity or sponsored event.

Deadly Weapons and Dangerous Instruments or Devices

Possession or use of any prohibited weapon, dangerous instrument, or device will not be tolerated in the College environment. Georgia law defines dangerous instrument as: "any instrument, article or substance which, under the circumstances in which it is used, attempted to be used or threatened to be used, is readily capable of causing death or serious physical injury, or any disabling chemical spray . . .".

Enforcement

The employee/student against whom such action is taken shall be entitled to the benefits of the procedures identified in the OFTC College Personnel Policy or Student Handbook. Persons not subject to the College Personnel Policy or Student Code of Conduct who are suspected of violating or determined to have violated this Policy will be directed to leave the premises and may be reported to law enforcement authorities for criminal prosecution, as appropriate.

Access to Campus Facilities

The President of OFTC shall have authority to designate certain campus areas or facilities as public areas or facilities, which shall be open to members of the general public. All faculty and staff shall conspicuously display an identification badge issued by the College at all times while on campus property. All students shall be required to possess a valid student identification card at all times while on campus property, and shall present the same to faculty or staff when requested. Oconee Fall Line Technical College does not own or operate any resident facilities for students.
