



## OCONEE FALL LINE TECHNICAL COLLEGE SOUTH CAMPUS EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS GUIDE

This Emergency Preparedness Guide serves as a quick reference for OFTC employees by providing a timely response plan to prevent injury or damage to persons or property. This guide is not designed to replace any current plans or procedures that are in place. Please familiarize yourself with those plans, policies, and procedures which have been implemented. Use this guide as a supplement for the purpose of quick notification for crisis response. In critical situations, **DIAL 911** and speak to a public safety official.

### **FIRE:**

In building or on premises requiring evacuation.

**Signals:** Fire alarm sounds.



**Action Steps:**

1. One person pulls nearest fire alarm for ACTIVATION.
2. Follow posted Evacuation route to Designated Rally Point.
3. Safety team check restrooms/other areas for students/employees and assist physically challenged persons.
4. Keep fire lanes open around the buildings.
5. Instructors: Take class roster to account for all students. Report missing students to Security Office.
6. CALL 911 AND (478) 275-6589 to report a Fire.

### **FIRE EXTINGUISHER INSTRUCTIONS:** REMEMBER 'PASS'



- "P"- PULL safety pin from the handle
- "A"-AIM at the base of the fire.
- "S"-SQUEEZE- trigger handle (generally the top pushes down).
- "S"-SWEEP from side to side at the base of the fire.

### **FIRE DRILL PROCEDURES:**



WHEN THE FIRE ALARM SOUNDS

1. Follow posted evacuation route to closest exit.
2. Last one out close doors in labs/classrooms.
3. Proceed to designated Rally Point with Instructor.
4. Remain at Rally Point until all clear signal is given.

**DO NOT LEAVE THE CAMPUS**

5. While evacuating building, no running, pushing, smoking, or loud talking. Move quickly and orderly.

### **SEVERE WEATHER**



Severe Weather **WATCH**, continue with normal activities. Security and administrators monitor conditions Via weather radio/television. A Severe Weather **WARNING**; campus alert system is activated. Administration alert to weather advisories to take appropriate measures for closing the campus.



### **TORNADO WATCH**

Conditions exist in immediate area for tornadoes. Alert Students and Employees to review posted [Evacuation Map](#) and location of tornado shelter areas.

**TORNADO WARNING:** Tornado sighted in immediate area; Campus Alert System is activated. Employees and students proceed immediately to closest shelter. Remain in shelter until "**ALL CLEAR**" is announced. Employees and students return to resume normal activities.

### **ACCIDENTS AND MEDICAL EMERGENCIES:**



- Call EMS/ 911 and
- Campus Security at 478-275-6589

**Action Steps:** Take the following actions:

1. Render First Aid but do not exceed your level of training.
2. Call or have someone call EMS and Campus Security. State nature of emergency; give location of building/room #.
3. First Aid Kits are located throughout the campus.
4. Contact Security Office and stay with the sick/injured.
5. Disperse the crowd, if possible.
6. Complete Incident form; return it to Security Office and Human Resource Office.

**College personnel will not provide personal transportation.**

### **LOCKDOWN PROTOCOL**



Some emergency situations may require the campus to go into "**lockdown mode**" for the following:

- Someone with a weapon or shots being fired.
- A hostage situation.
- Civil Disturbance or a Riot has occurred.
- Any other reason deemed appropriate by the college.

Announcement made: **EXECUTE LOCKDOWN**

**ALL** faculty, staff, students, and campus visitors must follow instructions below:

- Students, faculty, staff, and Campus Visitors in hallways, common areas, and/or any outside locations go to first available room or designated safe room.
- Instructors turn out lights, lock the rooms from the inside
- Windows located in the room close blinds or shades.
- The doorways are barricaded.
- Turn off equipment and other noises that would aid detection.
- Students sit on floor out of site of doors & windows. No noise.
- Take cover in case of a gunman.
- **OFTC Crisis Team** will be called into Action

President/designee will announce "**ALL CLEAR**" and College/Center will return to normal status.

### **BOMB OR BOMB THREAT**



**DEFINITION:** A device that may or may not have exploded within the college buildings or on the premises. **DO NOT EVACUATE THE BUILDING UNTIL DIRECTED**

**STEPS OF ACTION:** Record as many of the caller's exact words
